The RE Director checks all volunteers on the internet court database as well as familywatchdog.us (a national sex offender registry).

There is a two-adult policy in place for classes in RE. This means that 2 adults are in the class at all times (this is for safety and comfort; teachers might be alone in a class if one is going to the bathroom, for instance). An exception to this rule is if it would make the children or youth RE class have an equal or more adults than children, then an open door policy is used instead. For example, in the High School (YRUU) class, there is usually only 1 or 2 youth, so as long as the windows to the room are uncovered, or the door is open, class continues.

There is a phone extension in each class or area that connect to all of the other phones in the building. The RE Director will train volunteers to know how to use the intercom system on the phones in case the need arises. The phones are also regular phones and a call to 9-1-1 is doable.

Parents must sign their children in and out of their RE Classes and teachers do not release the children until they have made contact with the parent(s).
